A Word to Fathers ~

Being Discontented

There are two different forms of discontentedness. The first one is that we feel undervalued. We may have a job where we feel we are clearly over-qualified. Our gifts and talents and education are not being utilized. On top of that, it seems as though those who are less talented and less educated are being recognized and promoted ahead of us. I have a great example of this concerning a friend I have who is a college professor. He could not understand why our church was not recognizing his education and Bible knowledge. After all, he had a PHD. One time while he was expressing his discontent, I had a suggestion. I told him he should volunteer for the parking lot ministry. The parking lot ministry is one of those positions that a lot of people would consider below them. They might think that anybody can direct traffic. They may think that being a worship leader, a Bible teacher or the pastor's best friend would be more suited to them. But, directing traffic at a church is a very important job. The very first person a visitor is going to meet is the parking lot person. His first impression will be made when he meets the parking lot staff. He may be in a desperate situation. That lowly parking lot attendant may be the catalyst that saves a life. He will have a crown waiting for him in heaven. After my friend's initial shock and dismay he decided to take my advice. A few weeks later he called to tell me that was the best advice he had ever been given. He found life and friendship in taking the low position.

The second kind of discontentedness is just the opposite. We see the gifts and talents and education of others and feel discontented because God has not blessed us in the same way. You may be thinking "if I had only made different decisions in my life." As they say, hindsight is 20/20. There is a great Kia commercial featuring Josh Jacobs of the Raiders. It starts out with him saying, "I often wonder what I would say if I ever met my younger self." Then he meets a young boy homeless like Josh had been, he tells him it's hard being homeless but you need to press on and believe in yourself. The boy is handed a football helmet and begins to run onto a field, the next thing you see he is Josh walking unto a football field and the crowd cheering. I love that story. God made you with all your gifts, talents and imperfections. He has given you a job a position for you to use for His glory and to advance His kingdom.

The spirit of disconnectedness leads to sin. We lose our faith in God and descend into what Paul the Apostle says are the works of the flesh, "hatred, discord, jealousy, selfish ambition, envy, etc. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. We all have a choice of finding our contentment in Christ.

The goal of Impact is to give back and serve the students at



Having a high school diploma is important but it doesn't guarantee that you will be able to get into college. It can be a difficult process these days. Here are 12 tips/suggestions for students considering college entrance:

1. Plan ahead. When you know what college you want to go to, go to their website to make sure that you are taking the courses that they recommend.
2. Align your course titles with those of Western Christian so that the colleges will recognize what you have been doing.
3. Check the Western Christian website to see what courses CSU and UC want you to take.
4. Check this website for more information about how to get into college as a homeschooler: Look at www.californiacolleges.edu/#/
5. Be involved in the community so that you can talk about your experiences and the ways that you have made a difference to people. Colleges want smart and academic students, but they also want people who can change the world for the better.
6. Find out what you do well, do it, and learn how to write about it. Colleges are looking for **you to explain to them why you are "head and shoulders better" than the others who are also applying to college.**
7. Take the tests. Take the SAT. Take the ACT. Take the SAT II subject tests. Find objective ways to prove that you are who you say you are. Test taking is a learned skill. Practice, practice, practice.
8. Take AP courses and their corresponding tests.
9. Take some community college courses or enroll in the part-time program at Western Christian. This is another way to show that you are as good a student as your mother thinks you are.
10. Make sure that you have all the courses that Western Christian requires for a diploma.
11. Most importantly, pray for God to go before you in this whole process.

High School Biology

Biology is most exciting (and most truthful) when it is taught and learned in the context of our awesome Creator. His creation certainly reflects the majesty, wisdom, and power of God. Unfortunately, secular science is often taught in such a way as to become a stumbling block to the development of our faith. Science can instead be a stepping-stone to faith – the evidence for design is everywhere, especially in Biology! This course is taught with a Creation perspective. We will use the Apologia book, "Exploring Creation with Biology". Topics include the five kingdoms of life, the chemistry of life, cell structure and function, genetics, ecology, evolution (as a theory), as well as plant, animal, and human biology. Each week we will have a one-hour lecture/discussion period (generally using PowerPoint slides), followed by a one-hour lab.

Class time: Thursdays, 5—6:30 p.m. at Chino Valley Community Church

Tuition:

This is an upper division, year-long course. During the first semester, in American Government we will focus on the founding principles that formed America. Students will learn why The United States was created and how it stands as beacon of religious, civil, and economic freedom in the world. We will read from original source documents such as the Declaration of Independence, Federalist Papers, and the Constitution to learn how the three branches of American government were designed to control and limit power to protect freedom. These resources will supplement weekly reading from two books: Matthew Spaulding's *We Still Hold These Truths*, and Eric Metaxis' *If You Can Keep It*. Class discussion will explore how our founding principles have informed historical events and are being debated in today's political culture. Students will be challenged to use what they have learned to become active citizens in our democratic republic.

During the second semester, in Economics we will use Henry Hazlitt's book, *Economics in One Lesson*, as a springboard to explore the principles of micro and macroeconomics. This is a practical course that will require weekly reading of news sources for articles that illustrate each week's subject. Students will be exposed to the major economic systems, principles of supply and demand, government taxation and regulation, unions and other special interests, trade policies, minimum wage and rent control, and a variety of other current trends that are gaining interest like a universal basic income.

Will cover skills required to proceed into High School Algebra, and students completing it will be WELL PREPARED for Algebra 1. ****I get asked often, which math should my Jr Higher be doing?*** If your student does a decent job (80% average) on basic mathematics, especially multiplication & division, and maybe ok on fractions, he/she should take Pre-Algebra. The current "fashionable" trend in education these days (public and private) is that students should take Algebra I in 8th grade, which would mean Pre-Algebra in 7th. This works for some, and is (in my opinion) a GRAVE mistake for a lot of others! According to Bob Jones, this is an 8th grade curriculum.
