The curriculum is a proof-based presentation of Euclidean geometry as a model of God's creative ability. Unlike some integrated geometry curricula, the course is designed to focus on the principles of logical reason used by Euclid in his original system of geometry. It is important that students complete Algebra 1 or equivalent prior to enrollment. The algebra sequence is best taken without interruption. This means Algebra 2 is best taken in the year immediately following Algebra 1, although exceptionally motivated students may have little trouble recalling year-old concepts. Friday	Pre-Calculus	<p>Pre-Calculus is a two-semester review of mathematics courses designed as a checkpoint to prepare students for college calculus. The course is designed with the college-bound student in mind, and is practically necessary for higher-level math for any stem and stem-related field (the natural sciences like chemistry and physics, as well as other fields like economics, business, and engineering). Pre-calculus is a prerequisite for many lower-division college courses, but can be quite challenging for many students. It is recommended that a student take both algebra 2 and geometry prior to enrollment, but a highly capable and intrinsically motivated student might still excel without these courses. Teaching students to structure their thinking with arguments of coherence and correspondence will be the foundation of the course. We will also explore logical fallacies. Investigation of arguemtns for the existence of God will include the following facts amongst others: the universe appears to be finel tuned for its own existence; the earth seems to be finely tuned for life; and that life appears to have been designed. Studying the validity of scripture will include: historica evidences and fulfilled prophecy. The assurances of the death, burieal and resurrection of Jesus will be examined through scripture and extra biblical historical evidence.
